

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
PERRY TOWNSHIP
August 6, 2019

The committee-of-the-whole meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Perry Township was called to order by Chairman Dean A. Adam, at 7:30 p.m. on August 6, 2019 in the Township Municipal Building, 680 Moselem Springs Road, Shoemakersville, PA.

A roll call was held and the following Supervisors were present:

Also present at the committee meeting were:

Comments:

Chairman Adam asked for public comments.

Nancy James, Ridge Road, shared with the Board an incident that occurred near her home where a truck bottomed out trying to turn around in a driveway. Mrs. James wanted to know if something could be done to prevent this from happening again. Chairman Adam stated the township isn't responsible for fixing a private driveway. Mrs. James wanted to know about downed wires from the storm. Chairman Adam stated the Verizon wires are their responsibility and it seems that Met-Ed is no longer allowing other utilities to use their poles.

Kenny James, Ridge Road, asked if Glen Gery is building a new plant. The business was allegedly sold and the Board hasn't been told of any future plans. Mark Wm. Stitzel stated the plant was doing soil borings.

Dave Lindenmuth, Recreation Park, asked the Board for their opinions about the sandbox at the recreation park because it needs more sand. Lance N. Adam stated he has seen children playing in the sandbox during baseball events. Mark Wm. Stitzel disagreed with Mr. Adam's statement since he has never seen anyone playing in the sandbox. Dean A. Adam stated it's a cat box. The Board will make a decision at a later date.

Larry Krick, Main Street, stated the township is doing a super job mowing in his area. Mr. Krick asked about the burning of toxic materials. Chairman Adam stated they would be discussing the issue because of email complaints by residents.

Marshall Miller informed the Board the wires have finally been fixed at Bellevue Avenue and Main Street.

Invoices:

The Board of Supervisors reviewed a preliminary list of invoices

Minutes:

The Supervisors reviewed the unofficial minutes from the July 2nd Committee-of-the-Whole Meeting, the July 9th Supervisor's Meeting and the July 16th Recessed Meeting.

Reports:

Joseph Body was unable to attend tonight's meeting. The Board reviewed the zoning report and the zoning and engineering notes. The Board discussed the proposed closing of Zweizig Road to finish the Route 61 and Zweizig Road intersection improvements. Mark Wm. Stitzel, Roadmaster, stated he has recommended doing nightwork and not closing the road. The Board agreed Hamburg Logistics Park shall pay and install the stop signs at the four driveways before dedication of Logistics Drive. Secretary Adam will send a letter to HLP stating the

Board's confirmation. Lance N. Adam questioned if Zions Church will have a sign posted saying "No Trucks".

Review Code Red Policy:

The Board will review at next week's meeting.

Rac Geo II:

The Board discussed purchasing the Rac Geo II to track the townships signs and roads. The software was noticed at the PSATS Convention. Mark Wm. Stitzel made a motion, seconded by Dean A. Adam to purchase the Rac Geo II from Jamar Technologies for Two Thousand Three Hundred and Ninety-Five Dollars (\$2,395.00). Motion carried with all Supervisors voting yes.

Hamburg EMS Payment Request:

The Board reviewed the request from Hamburg EMS. Lance N. Adam made a motion seconded by Dean A. Adam to approve the bill to Stryker Flex Financial for Four Thousand Eight Hundred Dollars (\$4,800.00). Motion carried with all Supervisors voting yes.

Household Trash Burning Email:

The Board reviewed the emails concerning household trash burning. The Board discussed the concerns of the residents and asked what Title 25 was about. The office will obtain a full copy of Title 25 for next week's meeting.

Diamond Tex Quotes:

The Board discussed what occurred and what was approved in the past. Secretary Adam stated the Township purchased Diamond Tex in 2006. The Township paid for one truckload and the Athletic Association paid for one. In 2010, the Board talked about purchasing Diamond Tex however no decision was made. Chairman Adam said why do we want to purchase now at the end of the season and suggested waiting until the spring of next year. Lance N. Adam asked if Secretary Adam could add it to the agenda for the February 2020 meeting. A new quote sheet will be added to the February 2020 meeting agenda.

Comments:

Chairman Adam asked for public comments.

Nancy James, Ridge Road, stated Main Street is awful. Mark Wm. Stitzel stated UGI needs a permit for a crossover pipe before the work can be completed. The permits should be issued within the next two weeks.
